## Apology

Parents / carers

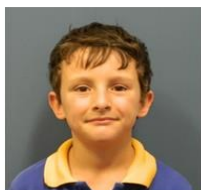

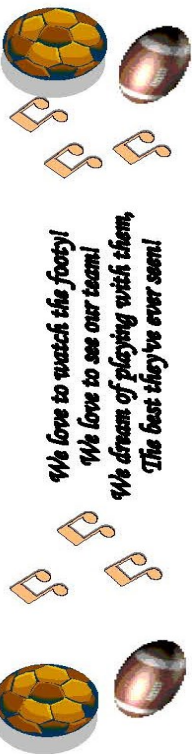
